2022 SECOND QUARTER REPORT ON FOOD/DRINK VENDORING SITE MONITORING AND ORIENTATION OF FOOD/DRINK VENDORS IN AWUTU SENYA EAST MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY

1.0. INTRODUCTION

Public Health Researchers have attributed the alarming rate at which food/drink borne infection cases are increasing partly due to the consumption of ready to eat food/drink from outside the home environment. Some public health practitioners are of the view that the food/drink preparation and vending sites are two key areas that must be concentrated on during activities and program of food safety, others are also of the view that the vendors health status must also be assessed since the health of the Handless can also contribute to the wholesomeness of the food/drink.

Since Environmental Health Officers are mandated by the local government act 936 of 2016 which states any person who discharged the duties of a Medical Officer or Sanitary Inspector now the Environmental Health Officer under the Infections Disease Ordinance (CAP78) for any area shall be an officer of the assembly of the area for the purpose of giving effect to enforcing by-laws relating to the Public Health made by the District Assembly, the Unit's submit this report for further action.

2.0. ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKING DURING MONITORING

To reduce the alarming rate at which food drink bone diseases are spreading among the popular through unhygienic preparation and sale of food drinking safeguard public health in the municipality the following specific activities were undertaken during monitoring visit to the above facilities.

Inspection to ensure environmental health sanitation food hygiene safety and nutrition standards were observed by food drink vendors

Inspection of food drink vendors health certificate of fitness o

Orientation and education of food drink beverage vendors and handlers on food hygiene safety sanitation and nutrition

Prosecution of recalcitrant food drinks vendors and handlers especially those operating without health certificate of fitness and invalid have certificates
